


A. Searching the Jewish records from Stryj, I found the birth records of Róza and Malie, two daughters of Pinkas Rothenberg, director of a sawmill, and Feiga Dwora Probst. The younger daughter Malie was born on 8 May 1902 - the same birthday as your grandmother.....






"I guess it started on May 29, I 929, when I was born to Count Zygmund Russocki and Countess Irena
